KZNDOE GETS PERFORMANCE- INCENTIVE

Because of its judicious and productive use the Infrastructure Budget, the KwaZulu-Natal Department of Education has qualified for an Performance-Based incentive allocation awarded by National Treasury, based on the outcomes of the Performance-Based Incentive System assessment process for the 2021/22 incentive allocation.

The Department attained a final score of 83% and qualifies for an incentive allocation of R105 million.

This incentive amount will form part of the Education Infrastructure Grant and will be confirmed by means of the conditional grant allocation.

“The assessment is in line with section 26(4) of the 2021 Division of Revenue Act (DoRA) and is further supported by guidelines on the performance-based incentive system, which outlines the submission time-frames and minimum requirements that pans should include.

“As a Department of Education in KwaZulu-Natal we congratulate our infrastructure unit for having been exemplary and working well over the year, thus becoming a recipient of this incentive for many years.

We encourage other units in the Department to emulate this good work ethic and creativity by our infrastructure unit.

The Department remains committed to clean and good governance,” said MEC Kwazi Mshengu.
