Learners, educators and parents pledged and committed themselves to ensuring that the 2022 National Senior Certificate Examination is free of irregularities during the KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Examination Pledge Signing Ceremony held at Little Flower Combined School, in Ixopo, under the Harry Gwala District.

The event was attended by MEC Mbali Frazer, senior officials of the Department and learners from different schools, who were pristinely dressed in their uniform.

All the stakeholders committed that they are going to ensure that they make the province proud by ensuring the examinations are peaceful and successful.

Speaking on behalf of Learners, Luyanda Dlamini, a Grade 12 Learner from Little Flower Combined School said, "as learners we promise exams with no irregularities. We will do this by giving it our all and working hard, so we see no reason to achieve by any other means."

Qiniso Mnguni, who is the Harry Gwala District Youth Manager, encouraged the Class of 2022 and spoke to learners about the opportunities the municipalities have.
