KUDOS TO THE CLASS OF 2019



T was a red carpet affair during the release of results for the 2019 National Senior Certificate examinations. This event which took place at the ICC on January 08, was characterised by glitz, glamour and razzmatazz. The palpable excitement was because the Class of 2019 had made history, becoming the first cohort of learners since the dawn of democracy, to go beyond the 80% mark.

The event was attended by the Premier of KwaZulu-Natal, Sihle Zikalala, His Majesty, King Goodwill Zwelithini, Members of the Provincial Executive, Members of the

Provincial Legislature, corporate citizens, parents and learners.

"As KwaZulu-Natal we have improved again and obtained 81.3% from 76.2% in 2018. This is a historic achievement since the 1994 democratic breakthrough as this pass percentage for NSC exams is comparable to none in the past. The 2019 pass percentage represents 81.3% of candidates who passed out of 116 937 candidates who sat for the final examinations last year. We are not only boasting in terms of numbers but also the quality. Our bachelor passes have increased from 38

573 in 2018 to 44 189 in 2019. In percentages that translates to 37.8% in 2019 compared to 33.2% in 2018" said the MEC. Ugu District also made history by moving very close to 90% mark, becoming the top performing district in the province. "We congratulate Ugu District for being the best performing District in 2019. We also congratulate all twelve districts as they recorded improvements in 2019. We particularly congratulate llembe District for being the most improved District by 5.90%," the MEC said.










STATE OF READINESS FOR 2020 ACADEMIC YEAR

HOPE FOR NQUNDU COMBINED SCHOOL









HE community of KwaNgundu in Nkandla took to the streets and disrupted teaching and learning demanding that grades 11 and 12 be added to the school. The parents complained that after their children complete grade 10 in Ngundu Combined, they have nowhere to go as other schools are reluctant to accept their children and if they are accepted, it means they need to find places to rent for their children because the schools are far. Upon hearing this, the MEC held a meeting with the community on January 17, to find ways of assisting the community. "We commend the

community for not destroying school property during the protest. We are here to come up with a solution to best assist not only Ngundu Combined, but neighbouring schools because they are also affected. We have agreed that we will implement grade 11 in 2020 and also provide a mobile classroom to accommodate them. It is also necessary that we form a committee to look at the issues affecting schools in the surrounding areas holistically because we have noted that they all have a declining enrolment," the MEC said. Concluding his speech, the

MEC urged the community to safeguard the school and work together to improve the lives of learners because for some families, they are the only hope out of poverty."

DEPUTY MINISTER VISITS KZN

N January 15, which was the first day of the academic year, the Deputy Minister for Basic Education, Dr Reginah Mhaule and MEC Kwazi Mshengu, conducted a back to school monitoring visit at Havenpark Secondary under Pinetown District. During the assembly, the Deputy Minister told learners to treat 2020 as a year of excellence and encouraged them to take their work serious from the first day of schooling. She also encouraged love for reading and said there must be no day that passes without reading.

In his remarks, MEC Mshengu urged learners to do their work tirelessly and remain focused. "When we say no to drugs and alcohol, and no to early pregnancy, we are not doing it for us, but we are only doing it to protect your future". Learners from all grades of this school pledged that they will put more effort to ensure that they get good results at the end of this year.

with Head Office staff on January 20, at the Pietermaritzburg City Hall. The Head of Department Dr Enoch Nzama, in his welcome mentioned that, "it is our duty to ensure that the department performs. We all have to remain focused so that the culture of quality teaching and learning continues"

During his address, the MEC urged employees of the department to be actively engaged in the mission and vision of the department. "We should all work towards realizing our vision and we must set our vision in the

classroom in order to produce skilled learners. The 81.3% pass rate for our grade is now history, therefore aiming higher is the only option." He further stressed that the staff should ceaselessly engage in skills development programmes as they are tasked with a significance task of building an educated nation. "By 2030 South Africans should have access to the highest level of quality, which must elevate improved learning outcomes. Within the next 10 years from now, we should be able to increase the number of bachelor passes," he continued.

Mshengu spoke about the School Nutrition Programme, he encouraged everyone that all protocol must be followed during an NSNP process and everyone should be granted equal opportunity. He also warned the staff to refrain from any illegal dealings pertaining to NSNP. "We appeal to all officials to at least adopt one school each, and it is compulsory for all SMS members to adopt a minimum of 5 schools each," said the MEC
