OFFICIAL OPENING OF BATTLEFIELDS PRIMARY SCHOOL

The MEC for Education, Mr Siphso Hlomuka, officially handed over Battlefields Primary School, located in the Dundee area within the Endumeni Local Municipality under uMzinyathi District. The handover of the smart school follows the 100% completion of the project in 2022, with a monetary value of R46,578,776.42. The programme director, DDG Advocate Masuku, welcomed all distinguished guests and the community at large, who came out in numbers to witness the official handover of Battlefields Primary School.

The DDG for Institutional Development Support, Ms Weziwe Hadebe, outlined the infrastructural development of the school and detailed the purpose of the day. DDG Mbongiseni Mazibuko declared that the school being handed over is a smart school, the 1st of its kind under uMzinyathi District. It is a digitized school where all teachers have been equipped with laptops, and the school offers free Wi-Fi for the benefit of both teachers and learners.

During the delivery of messages of support, organized labour members and the School Governing Body Chairperson thanked the Department for listening to the public's concerns by delivering on their promises and exceeding expectations. They also cautioned the community against vandalism and negligence.

Ms Fiona Tooray, the Principal of Battlefields Primary School, shared the history of the school, noting that it was previously known as Dundee Junior Primary School, which was in a dilapidated state. She extended her appreciation to the MEC for elevating public schools to the highest standards. The District Director for uMzinyathi, Mr S. Kheswa, echoed the principal's sentiments and expressed his gratitude to the MEC, promising to advocate against the vandalism of infrastructure.

Introducing the MEC for Education, the Deputy Mayor for uMzinyathi, Ms Mchunu, expressed her satisfaction with the school infrastructure. She remarked that the MEC for Education has

indeed delivered on the government's mandate to grow KwaZulu-Natal together. When the MEC for Education took to the podium, he noted and appreciated that the uMzinyathi District is the most improved district in terms of the 2023 NSC Examination Results.

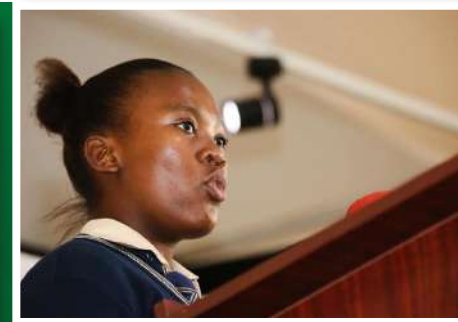

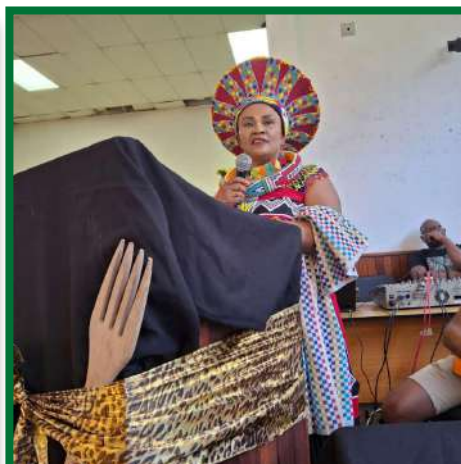

The purpose of the workshop was to familiarize all district officials with the approved Coding and Robotics CAPS document for the Foundation Phase, to equip them in preparation for training teachers within their districts, to ensure uniformity of training across districts, and to develop a plan for the training of Foundation Phase teachers.

The Department of Basic Education (DBE) is embarking on preparing a system for imple-

mentation of the Foundation Phase Coding and Robotics CAPS in 2025 for Grades R-3. Coding and Robotics will be introduced as a subject in the Foundation Phase in 2025. This subject aims to ensure learners acquire essential knowledge and skills, preparing them for real life and fostering lifelong learning. It supports personal growth by helping learners develop their interests, talents, and character, promoting critical thinking and decision-making, all while having fun.

During the three-day workshop, participants engaged in activities that included coding patterns, building robots and circuits, debugging, and solving a maze through pattern recognition,

programming, and navigation. These activities enabled the participants to apply computational thinking skills, design thinking, and the four Cs: Critical Thinking, Creativity, Collaboration, and Communication.

decision-making, urging stakeholders to work together to support schools. He acknowledged the increasing difficulty in managing finances and expressed hope that the national treasury would provide assistance.

NSFAS LAUNCHED AT EDENDALE TECHNICAL HIGH SCHOOL

On the 21 September 2024 Edendale Technical High School, Pietermaritzburg under UMgungundlovu District benefited from the maiden application drive of the 2025 National Student Financial Aid Scheme. Thus follows the official launch of the 2025 NSFAS funding application by the Minister of Higher Education and Training Dr Nobuhle Nkabinde recently.

Today scores of learners braved the cold and rainy weather conditions some accompanied by parents to be part of the first

batch to apply. Applications will close on 30th November 2024, coinciding with the launch of the application season NSFAS dispatched its agent to the high Schools in all the nine Provinces.

During the application drive the NSFAS team assisted learners and out of school youth to apply for NSFAS funding for the 2025 Academic year.

To qualify for NSFAS funding to study at a public Universities and TVET colleges, applicants must meet the following criteria.

- * Be a South African citizen
- * Register at any public University or TVET college
- * Come from a family with a combined annual income of R350, 000 and below and R600, 000 for a person living with disabilities.

NSFAS also offers funding in the form of loan scheme for the missing middle, individual who came households with combined income between R350 000 to 600.000 may also apply for the NSFAS loan.
