## MEC Frazer Hails Umlazi District For Significant Improvement In 2023 Nsc Exam Results

**U**mlazi District hosted NSC Excellents Awards Ceremony on the 02 November 2024 at Northwood Boys High School to honour and celebrate the significant improvement in the NSC results of the Class of 2023. Umlazi District obtained 80.0% in 2021 and 82.8% in 2022. The district has improved with a significant increase of 3.3% in 2023 and achieved 86.1% pass rate.

Out of 21 370 NSC candidates, an impressive 9 636 achieved bachelor passes, making Umlazi the leading district in bachelor passes in KwaZulu-Natal.

Umlazi is the leading district in Mathematics and Physics in the whole country. In the 2023 NSC exams, Umlazi increased the number of schools that achieved a 100% pass rate from 17 to 20, and those that performed at 80% and above rose from 86 to 101.

The District Director, Ms Busi

Mahlambi, the first female director in the history of Umlazi, quoted the great philosophy, Aristotle who once said “Excellence is never an accident, it is always the result of high intention, sincere effort and intelligent execution. It represents the wise choice of many alternatives – choice, not chance, determines your destiny.”

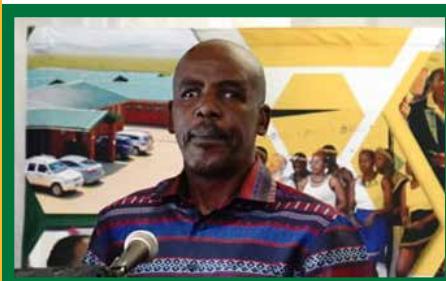
## 2023 Matric Excellence Awards at the Klipriver Circuit.

## MEC Frazer Introduces a Professional Team for Infrastructure Upgrades at Adams College

**T**he KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Education, Ms Mbali Frazer on 20 February 2024, introduced a professional team for the infrastructure upgrade at Adams College, in Umlazi District.

MEC Frazer announced that the Independent Development Trust (IDT) will be the Implementing Agent for the Adams College infrastructure upgrade.

The scope of work comprises the major refurbishment and rehabilitation of the Administration Block, standard classrooms, Multi-purpose rooms, computer rooms, and hostels for boys and girls.

The project will also include the construction of new fencing, relocation of sports fields and change rooms, and reticulation of water, sewer, and stormwater drainage.

This development will also include internal road and walkway reticulation, smart classrooms, decommissioning and installation of new mechanical equipment, up-

grading electrical installation and connections, upgrading firefighting equipment, compliances and all other building regulation compliances, inclusive access to all buildings and facilities as well as rehabilitation of heritage buildings.

The project will be implemented in terms of the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP), and job opportunities will be prioritized for the youth, women, military veterans as well as LGBTQIA+.

SMMEs from the local community will benefit from this project. The project will provide skills development opportunities by training unskilled and semi-skilled workers throughout the project.

"This is in line with our goals as the KwaZulu-Natal Department of Education, which is to create a safe, modern, vibrant, and technologically advanced learning environment for the delivery of quality education for generations to come," said MEC Frazer.

The principal of Adams College, Mr Zulu, expressed gratitude for the development. He further committed that Adams College will continue to work hard to maintain the 100% pass rate and improve their results to a quality 100%.

## MEC Frazer Introduces building contractor for Ohlange High School.

**T**he KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Education, Ms Mbali Frazer officially introduced a building contractor for an upgrade of soon to be the State-of-the-art Historical Institution of Ohlange High School, Pinetown District.

The construction project of Ohlanga High School will cost the department R 127,8 million. The construction is scheduled to run over a period of 10 months. The project will provide job creation and priority will be given to local sub-contractors owned by women, youth, disabled persons, military veterans and LGBTQ

The scope of work includes a new mechanical workshop, a multi-purpose classroom, a computer room, a team-teaching area, and new ablution facilities for both boys and girls. It also includes double-story classrooms and conduct repairs on all existing classrooms. Additionally, there will be extensive repairs and addi-

tions to the admin block, install perimeter fencing, and create new parking bays, an assembly area, and a combi court.

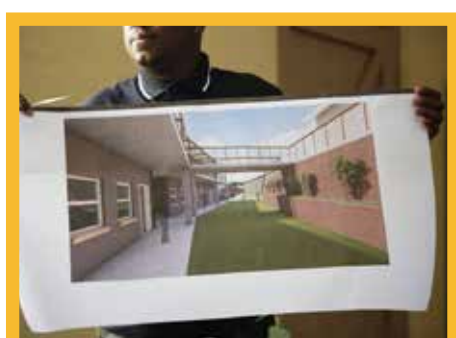

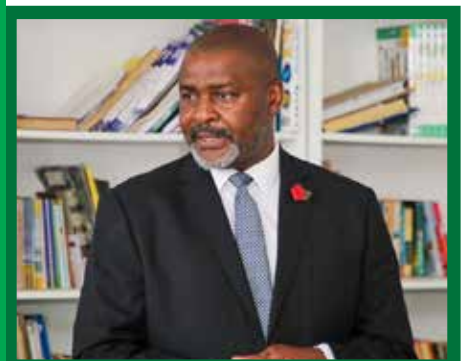

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## Embracing Learning Through Play For ECD With VVOB

**V**VOB- Education for development partners, the Department of Basic Education (DBE), the South African Council for Educators (SACE), and the Kwa-Zulu-Natal Provincial Department of Education (KZNDoE) aims to improve Early Grade Reading Instruction for Home Language in the Foundation Phase. Together they held a five days seminar on 12-16 February 2024 at Riverside Hotel, Durban. VVOB is introducing two programmes that are aimed at empowering ECD educators and ECD learners to have fun learning while playing.

The EGRI Programme aims to improve the quality of early grade reading instruction in South Africa. The programme focuses on providing Continuous Professional Development (CPD) courses and resources for teachers who teach reading in the Foundation Phase, specifically Grade R-3. By offering accessible and practical learning materials, the EGRI Programme aims to enhance teachers' instructional practices and ultimately improve

learners' reading outcomes.

The second one is Funda Ud-lale Nathi, translated as "Learn and play with us" from IsiZulu, which aims to strengthen the ability of ECD practitioners at national and provincial level to understand and apply play based pedagogies.

The (F.U.N.) project is an initiative aimed at making learning fun and interactive for children using blended learning professional development approach. The project focuses on introducing playful teaching methods in schools, where educators incorporate games, activities and creative approaches to engage children in their learning processes.

VVOB is inviting all ECD educators to enrol on the free courses that have been developed by the Department of Basic Education and the South African Council for Educators, with support of VVOB in South Africa. Some of the courses are endorsed by SACE attracting CPTD points.

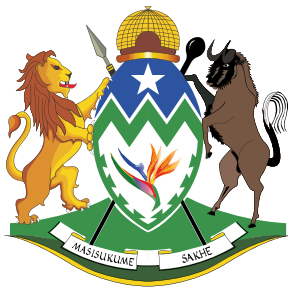
