

2024 NSC STATE OF READINESS MEDIA BRIEFING

On 9 October 2024, KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Education, Mr Siphso Hlomuka, expressed confidence in the province's readiness for the 2024 matric exams. At a media briefing held at Westville Boys High School in Durban, the MEC highlighted the department's far-reaching efforts to prepare matric learners for their final exams.

These efforts included winter and spring classes designed to enhance learner performance. While the department has set its sights on achieving a 100% pass rate, MEC Hlomuka remains optimistic about securing at least a 90% pass rate, acknowledging potential challenges that may arise.

The KwaZulu-Natal Department of Education will administer exams for 172,433 full-time and 18,019 part-time candidates,

making it the largest examination system in the country. To manage the process, 6,343 invigilators will supervise the exams in 6,710 rooms. Exam materials will be distributed through 13 nodal points and 103 collection centres to ensure smooth operations.

To further bolster learner readiness, the department organized winter and spring camps, providing additional academic support, including weekend tuition sessions. These efforts aim to equip learners for the final push ahead of the exams.



The marking process will commence on 1 December 2024 at 32 marking centres, with 7,614 markers involved. The final NSC results are scheduled for release on 15 January 2025.

MEC Hlomuka expressed his gratitude to teachers, school officials, and parents for their dedi-

cation in preparing the Class of 2024, ensuring they are ready for this critical milestone.

2024 NSC EXAMINATIONS

The KwaZulu-Natal Department of Education has embarked on rigorous monitoring of the 2024 National Senior Certificate (NSC) examinations across districts to ensure adherence to standards and provide motivation to learners.

On 21 October 2024, KwaZulu-Natal Premier Mr Thamsanqa Ntuli and MEC for Education Mr Siphon Hlomuka monitored the English Paper 3 exam at Isolemamba High School in Umlazi District. Despite heavy rains and warnings from the South African Weather Service, they braved the conditions to oversee the exams and engage with learners. Premier Ntuli, acknowledging the school's strong academic track record, encouraged learners by saying, "Now is the moment to realize your dreams, and I know for sure that your success is guaranteed."

On 24 October, MEC Hlomuka continued his visits, joining senior officials at Ingula High School in uThukela District. Ac-

companied by Dr David Chonco, Dr Ngogi Mahaye, and District Director Ms Mapaseka Mokoenana, MEC Hlomuka motivated the 141 candidates, advising them to "write with confidence" and avoid the pitfalls of cheating. Reflecting on a past incident where misconduct led to withheld results, he emphasized integrity and expressed hope for Ingula High School to achieve a 100% pass rate. MEC Hlomuka's visit is a part of the department's broader programme to inspire matriculants. He further concluded his engagement by affirming the department's commitment to an error-free examination period and wishing all candidates success.



Following the monitoring, they held a debriefing at Dedangifunde High School, where MEC Hlomuka commended educators for their commitment despite challenging conditions and reaffirmed his confidence in the province's academic targets.

Dr Penniston unequivocally addressed the paramount importance of preparedness for the upcoming October/November examinations and underscored the absolute necessity of upholding integrity in examinations and assessments. He left no room for doubt about the critical roles and responsibilities of educators and school principals in ensuring the utmost fairness and credibility of the examinations.

During the meeting, Dr Penniston emphatically elucidated the se-

vere repercussions of misconduct during examinations, emphasizing the justice and fairness theory, which unequivocally dictates that all candidates must face an equal level of challenge, and none should be granted an unfair advantage.


Dr Penniston also voiced grave concerns about substandard invigilation and the escalating prevalence of examination malpractice in South Africa, including KwaZulu-Natal. He referred to specific

circulars, including KZN Circular No. 77 of 2024, KZN Circular No. 119 of 2022, and KZN Circular No. 126 of 2022, which rigorously address seating arrangements,

tamper-proof exam papers, and stern warnings against malpractice during examinations.

In conclusion, Dr Penniston confidently underscored the indelible link between integrity, credibility, trust, and enduring success, citing Michael Josephson: "Without integrity there is no credibility. Without credibility there is no trust. And without trust there is no lasting success."

These sections, currently suspended by President Cyril Ramaphosa, focus on school authority regarding admissions and language policy. Political-level consultations are currently underway.

During the session, attendees had the chance to ask questions and create a collaborative environment to discuss how the BELA Act would impact educational governance at local and national levels. They also discussed the myths associated with the Act. The session emphasized the importance of a unified approach to implementing legislative changes to ensure that education remains inclusive, equitable, and forward-thinking.
