he MEC, Ms Mbali Frazer, officially opened Bright Future Special School in Newlands East, under Umlazi District. Among the attendees were the Head of Department, Mr Nkosinathi Ngcobo, DDG for Institutional Development and Support, Ms Weziwe Hadebe, DDG for Corporate Management Services, Advocate Bheki Masuku, DDG for Curriculum Management and Delivery, Mr Mbongiseni Mazibuko, Members of Senior Management, Head Office and District officials, educators, principals, department stakeholders, parents, and learners.

Umlazi District has the highest learner enrolment among districts, with most schools in townships ranking as quintile 3, 4, and 5. Special schools like Bright Future are being prioritized by the department of education due to the ongoing ICT projects. The Chief Director of Rural and Inclusive Education, Ms. Jabu Khoza, said that 350 teachers are employed in various special schools, including house mothers, administrators, gardeners, and teacher aiders. The ICT Resources supplied to Bright Future Special School include 1 smart screen, 1 ultra-short throw projector, 35 Normal digital classroom projectors, 36 non-reflective whiteboards, 1 chargeable laptop trolley, 40 learner laptops, 51 teacher laptops, 1 content Access point, 1 school based WI-FI resources and 26 access point.

The MEC, Ms Mbali Frazer said that, "the Bright Future Special School is officially opned in memory of the late principal, Mr Sipho Nkosi, She said the best way to honour Mr Nkosi's memory is to take good care of the school, by protecting it from vandalism and most importantly, by ensuring that it remains known with academic and artistic brilliance for all the learners who walk through the gates of Bright Future Special School. The MEC emphasized the Department's role in promoting Nelson Mandela's call for a better world, emphasizing the power of everyone to make a difference.

LTSM DELIVERY WAREHOUSE INSPECTION









he KwaZulu Natal MEC for Education, Ms Mbali Frazer together with the Head of Department, Mr Nkosinathi Ngcobo inspected the state of readiness of the LTSM delivery for the 2024 academic year on the 26th of September 2023 at Ndabase printing solutions warehouse in Amanzimtoti.

Mr Shabaan Hendricks, Ndabase printing solutions Managing Director, did a presentation on progress update on central procurement of textbooks and stationery. In his presentation, he mentioned that the department placed batch 1 textbooks orders on the 30th of June 2023, to the value of two hundred and sixty-seven million. "Curriculum directorates, ECD, GET and FET phases were consulted on stationary specifications per learner and non-learner pack in April 2023," said Mr Hendricks. The department re-apportion the stationery budget from 30% to 40% of the LTSM budget to ensure that annual inflationary costs could be managed more effectively.

In relation to tool for furniture repairs at schools, Mr. Thanda Nyide who is the CEO of Ndabase Printing Solutions and his colleagues developed a website app to help schools acquire desks online, which will be very helpful for principals to oversee this process online. Also, the app will be accessible to the management of the Department, who may use it to track how quickly schools are receiving desks. The tool places emphasis on strengthening activities to restore, repair and preserve existing furniture at schools using technology.

waZulu-Natal MEC for Education, Ms Mbali Frazer officially opened the State-Of-The-Art Xoloxolo Primary School on the 15th of September 2023 in Kokstad, under the Harry Gwala District.

The MEC was joined by the Head of Department, Mr Nkosinathi Ngcobo, Advocate Bheki Masuku, the DDG: Corporate Management, Ms Weziwe Hadebe, the DDG: Institutional Development and Support, the senior management, officials of the department, principals, educators, parents, learners and education stakeholders.

The new smart school consists of 1 administration block, 25 standard classrooms, 5 Grade R classrooms, 1 garden store, 1 gate house, 1 school nutrition programme kitchen, 6 girls toilets, 6 boys toilets, 2 teachers toilets (1 male, 1 urinary and 2 females) 1 toilet for disabled peo-



ple with disabilities and landscaping.

The ICT resources installed at XoloXolo Primary School include 1 smart interactive screen, 1 ultra-short throw projector, 28 normal digital classroom projectors, 29 non-reflective whiteboards, 1 chargeable laptop trolley, 40 learner laptops, 25 teacher laptops, 1 content server, 1 router with data sim card and 11 access points. The smart school is equipped with Wi-Fi and internet connection and the curriculum content is loaded on the server.

"The construction of this magnificent school costs more than R56 million and the school now stands as a beacon of hope for the learners of kokstad and the entire Harry Gwala District," said MEC Frazer. She said Xoloxolo Primary is yet another fine example of the Kwa-Zulu-Natal Department of Education's commitment to the provision of a conducive and safe environment for quality teaching and learning to take place.



During her address, MEC Frazer appealed to the community of Kokstad to protect Xoloxolo from criminal activities as well as other attempts to disrupt teaching and learning at the school.

50 DAYS COUNT DOWN EVENT

he KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Education, Ms Mbali Frazer, together with the top management of the Department, conducted a countdown event before the start of the 2023 NSC exams. The DDG for Corporate Services, Advocate Bheki Masuku, who was directing the programme, encouraged learners to start their first step of their 100 miles. "With these 48 days left before final exams you can still do it," he said.

Among the attendees were the officials of the department, various education stakeholders, educators, and learners. Mr Mazibuko, the DDG for Curriculum Management and Delivery, when outlining the purpose of the event, said that the previous class obtained 83%, therefore, the Class of 2023 is expected to obtain 100%. If they fail at least, they should obtain more than 83%.

Speaking in the hall packed by learners coming from various schools across the district, the DDG raised that, "we are here today to indicate to you learners that the time is now against us. We are also here to motivate you that you can all make it if you can start right now to pay more attention to your studies," said Mr Mazibuko. Management, provided the message of support during the event. In his message he highlighted the struggle the Class of 2023 went through during the Covid-19 pandemic, where some lost their parents. "The class of 2023 is the class that will make us proud. The class that will make us proud. The class that won't use the load shedding as an excuse, but make a positive plan to ensure they study beyond those difficulties. The class that will not use their background as their excuse, but learners that will excel and make us proud."

The Head of Department, Mr Nathi Ngcobo, in his address outlined that 100% is a non-negotiable percent for the Class of 2023. "You are privileged that you attended Grade R and you were supported by your families up to this far. Your families depend on your education to change their lives. If you pass, you are not only doing it for yourselves, but for your families, for the province, and for the entire country. We want to see you next year in the higher-level institutions. To gain access to the higher institutions, you must pass Grade 12."

The MEC also motivated learners to study smart and encouraged them to rest when they are exhausted. The MEC further expressed her gratitude to all educators for their dedication in ensuring that learners are supported in every way in schools. "Your dedication in ensuring that our learners are taught regardless of the circumstances you are operating under, is recognized and appreciated.

The MEC rang the bell and light the candle, which symbolises that those learners are no longer expected to switch off their lights, but continuously study throughout the night.

In conclusion, the MEC urged the community to avoid disturbing schools during examinations, especially when they have grievances in their communities.

UNICEF FOUNDATION PHASE (SIX BRICKS) TRAINING WORKSHOP





he Department of Education in Kwa-Zulu Natal, General Education and Training (GET) and Early Childhood Development (ECD) directorates in partnership with UNICEF and Class Act, organised a training workshop on the use of Six Bricks (Learning Through Play) at Coastlands Hotel on the 30th August 2023.

The Department of Basic Education, the LEGO Foundation, UNICEF launched the Foundation Phase Initiative Programme (FPI) for play based learning using six LEGO bricks. The aim of this initiative is to strengthen the capacity of pre-primary and foundation phase work-force to deliver play-based learning through manipulatives. The goal is also to increase the





number of grade 3 learners to master the minimum language and numeracy competencies, to improve the access of quality ECD below grade 1.

Ms Busi Dladla, GET Director, during her interview outlined that she is very excited about this initiative. "I am very excited about this initiative as it will bring a lot of change in foundation phase, what I like more about the manipulatives is that we can teach them colours, how to count and language. We can do physical education through the Six Bricks."

In the workshop, Chief Educational Specialists (CESs), Teaching and Learning Support (TLS), GET and Grade R-3 Subject Advisors for all subjects were invited to attend the orien-





tation training. The Subject Advisors together with the UNICEF Trainers, will be expected to train SMTs and all grade R-3 teachers in the province.

Engenas Senona from UNICEF said, "most learners have challenges in class, but once they have manipulatives which are these six bricks, they can learn while playing which becomes fun when they have things that they can touch, feel and see they come out of their shells."
