MEC MSHENGU IN A BID TO ENSURE SAFETY IN PHOENIX SCHOOLS

In his capacity as both the Operation Sukuma Sakhe Ethekwini Champion and the MEC for the KwaZulu-Natal Department of Education, MEC Kwazi Mshengu visited the Phoenix area, North of Durban, to restore order and peace, following the unrest which resulted in????? the of killing many people in the area. MEC Mshengu was accompanied by the South African Police Services (SAPS) and South African Defense Force (SANDF). MEC expressed gratitude to the SAPS and SANDF officials: "On behalf of Government, we would like to thank all of you for being here today. We feel safe knowing that you are patrolling the area of Phoenix."

MEC also visited three schools in the Phoenix area, as the schools were re-opening for the third term. The three schools that were visited were Earlington Secondary, Greenbury Secondary and Hopeville Primary School. The MEC was accompanied by the Acting Head

of Department, Dr Barney Mthembu, the Chief Director for Special Needs Education Services (SNES), Ms Jabu Khoza; the Head of Communications, Mr Muzi Mahlambi; the Director for the Pinetown District, Ms Khayelihle Hadebe, the Chief Education Specialist for Governance and Management, Mr Member Zungu; officials from the Ministry and other Education Stakeholders such as Organised Labour, School Governing Body and Religious Leaders.

Another reason for the MEC to visit the three schools was to monitor the state of readiness, since the Minister of DBE, Ms Angie Motshekga announced that all the Intermediate Phase, learners from Grade R to 7 were to return to school without rotation by the 2nd of August 2021. The MEC also conducted school functionality and checked whether the COVID-19 school regulations were still being adhered to. "As the Department, we are here to monitor the re-opening of schools so that we are satisfied that there is continued effective teaching and learning. We know that there is fear for some of you, but we are here to assure the members of the community that they are in good hands. We are working with SAPS and SANDF to normalize the situation and to ensure the safety of everyone," said Mshengu.

During his visit, the MEC also motivated learners, "You as learners have a responsibility to stand up against racism. You are not too young to take responsibility. We need our schools to be a safe environment for everyone. We will also offer a psycho-social support to the learners of Phoenix, including other neighboring townships such as Inanda, Amawoti, Umlazi, Lamontville and in the area of Northdale in Umgungundlovu."

The MEC and stakeholders, released white balloons, as a gesture to bring peace in schools and in the area of Phoenix as a whole.

















MEC MSHENGU ASSESS VANDALISED SCHOOLS

The MEC visited some schools in Umlazi District in order to assess the damage caused during the recent unrest. The vandalized schools that were visited by the MEC were Bavumile Primary School and Mziwamandla Secondary School.

"These criminals had more information about the school, which allowed them to drill a hole behind the wall and take eighteen laptops," said MEC Mshengu after assessing the damage at Bavumile Primary School., He further urged the Umlazi community members not to purchase the stolen laptops, but to give authorities information so that these, "criminals can be caught."

A second meeting was held at Mziwamandla Secondary School where the school principal gave an account of the damage. The MEC stated that the plan going forward is to deliver mobile classrooms in order to ensure that teaching and learning is not affected. In closing, he implored the community to "protect schools just as they protect shops because that is where the future of the nation is built."











OFFICIAL OPENING MKHAMBA GARDENS PRIMARY SCHOOL

The MEC together with the Acting Head of Department, Dr Barney Mthembu, presided over the official opening of Mkhamba Gardens Primary School, under Othukela District.

The MEC and the Acting HoD also did a walkabout as part of Operation Siyahlola, which seeks to monitor teaching, learning and functionality in schools.

The Principal, Ms Susan Marais expressed her gratitude to the MEC for building such a state-of-the-art school. She also promised the MEC to deliver good results and ensured that the school is taken care of.

The MEC complimented the work done at the school, stressing that this is the kind of school that government will be building going forward. "This school is equipped with modern technology so that it keeps up with the demands of the Forth Industrial Revolution (4IR). We are in the process of building schools of this standard in all places, including rural areas and we wish to close the gap between schools in the urban areas and those in rural areas. Some of the schools will be renovated, as modernised teaching accessories will be introduced," said the MEC.






