Sipho Emmanuel Hlomuka is currently serving as the Member of the Executive Council (MEC) for Education in the KwaZulu-Natal province. He assumed this role on June 18, 2024, after previously serving as the KZN MEC for Transport, Community Safety, and Liaison.

Hlomuka has a strong academic background, having obtained a Master's Degree in Public Administration in 2020, an Honours Degree in Public Administration,

and a Bachelor's Degree in Public Administration from the University of KwaZulu-Natal (2003-2004). He completed his secondary education at Siyamukela High School in 1999.

In addition to his MEC role, Hlomuka also holds the position of ANC Deputy Secretary in KZN. He has held various leadership positions within the organization, including Secretary of ANC uKhahlamba Region (December 2014 to July 2018), Deputy Secretary of ANC uKhahlamba Region

(March 2012 to December 2014), Chairperson of ANC Youth League uKhahlamba Region (June 2009 to November 2016), and Board member of KZN NYDA for two years.

Prior to his current position, Hlomuka served as the Chief Operations Officer at the Ladysmith/Mnambithi Local Municipality (June 2013 to February 2015) and as the District Manager at uThukela for the Department of Public Works (April 2008 to May 2013).

Hlomuka puts great emphasis on the importance of collaboration to enhance people's lives. He believes that mutual respect and flexibility in protocol are essential to prevent confusion within the system. Additionally, he highlights the significance of sports in schools to support learners who may not excel academically but demonstrate talent.

MEC FRAZER OFFICIALLY OPENED VEZUKUSA PRIMARY SCHOOL.

KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Education, Ms Mbali Frazer officially opened and handed over a new state-of-the-art Vezukusa Primary School, 23 May 2024, in Jozini.

MEC Frazer was joined by the Mayor of Umkhanyakude District, Mr. Siphile Mdaka, Head of the Department, Mr. Nkosinathi Ngcobo, DDG Adv. Bheki Masuku, DDG Ms. Weziwe Hadebe, and the traditional leadership.

Vezukusa Primary School expended the Department of Education an amount of R21.1 million. Like all the new smart schools recently built by the Department, Vezukusa has modern technology for teaching and learning in the world of the 4IR.

The new Vezukusa consists of 8 standard classrooms, a multipurpose center, a media center, a computer room, an activity room, an admin block, an NSNP kitchen, a Grade R center, ablution facilities, a guard house, fencing, landscaping, and HOD office's.

MEC Frazer expressed gratitude to all stakeholders who contributed towards the project's success and committed to the community that more schools will be built.

"The Government has taken a decision to build smart schools in KZN, and I want to assure you as the community that as we build new smart schools, we are also aligning old schools with 4IR", said MEC Frazer.

MEC FRAZER OFFICIALLY OPENED TONGAAT SPECIAL SCHOOL.

KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Education, Ms Mbali Frazer on, 21 May 2024, officially opened and handed over a new state-of-the-art Tongaat Special School in eThekweni Municipality.

The Tongaat Special School project costs the Department R187 million. The school is 98% complete, and the contractor has partially handed over the site to the department for use in teaching and learning.

The new Tongaat Special School consists of 100 hostels for boys and 100 hostels for girls, four matrons flats, an administration block, 15 classrooms, three multipurpose rooms, 22 storerooms, a dining hall, laundry, a computer room, a media center, 4 HOD offices, parking, pump station, and a generator.

"The school belongs to the community. That is why the contractor had to employ people from the local community," said MEC Frazer.

She added that the community is responsible for protecting this school and giving all the support to the principal and educators in the best interests of the learners.

Mgai Primary School expended the Department of Education over R52.7 million. It consists of 16 new standard classrooms, a computer room, a guard house, team teaching with a multi-purpose classroom, abolition facilities for boys and girls, an NSNP kitchen, sports facilities, fencing, a borehole, and a fire water supply.

The project of Mgai Primary Construction created 72 job opportunities and business opportunities for 20 local people.

MEC Frazer urged the community to protect this school..

"We request parents to play a critical role in their children's education. You must work hand in hand with educators and the School Governing Body," said MEC Frazer.

She further expressed her gratitude to all stakeholders who played a critical role during the construction of Mgai Primary School.

GRADE 9 GENERAL EDUCATION CERTIFICATE (GEC) ADVOCACY ROADSHOW.

The Department of Education in KwaZulu-Natal dedicated week 20-24 of May 2024 to conduct an advocacy campaign in all 12 districts where districts were grouped according to district clusters. Districts MANCO was called to be addressed about the implementation of the GEC program which is a standardized qualification being piloted in South Africa for learners completing grade 9 to give any school leavers some type of currency they can use to either find a job, or pursue a different stream of schooling. The delegation committee for GEC Roadshow consisted of Mr Mbongiseni Mazibuko, DDG for Curriculum Management and Delivery who was also the chairperson of the delegation committee.

Ms Sindi Zakuza-Njakazi, Chief Director for Curriculum Management who was tasked to welcome guests and to outline the aim of GEC program, Dr. Raymond



Penniston, Chief Director for Examination, Assessment and Quality Assurance who was given a role to be the programme director for all sessions, Dr. Mjoli, CES for Quality Assurance who was giving overview of the GEC, broad goals, and conceptualization of GEC, Mr Kunene, DCES for Quality Assurance who presented components of GEC assessment.

In his address, the chairperson DDG Mazibuko outlined GEC that it is a flagship programme of the Department of Education designed to expand the learning pathways and success opportunities of South African Grade 9 learners. "The GEC is intended to formally recognize learner's

achievement at the end of the compulsory phase of schooling. Its primary purpose is to facilitate subject choices beyond Grade 9 and articulation between schools and TVET



colleges," said DDG Mazibuko.

In conclusion, DDG Mazibuko advised that GEC program is not introduced to promote decline in results as the Department of Education in KZN will be claiming position one in 2025. "The advocacy and training will continue until we are fully capacitated," concluded Mazibuko.

The above mentioned school has been producing excellent results for the past 7 years and this is due to high dedicated educators who work extra ordinary hours to try to keep up with the school's motto, "Strive for Excellence".

Our normal day starts at 06h30 for the matriculants and 7h00 for the rest of the school- that is Grade 8 to 10, bearing in mind that the Grade 11s are treated as matrics. What takes place in Grade 12 is the same in Grade 11.

Morning classes start at 06h30 and our first period commences at 07h45. After-noon classes start at 15h00 and finish at 17h00.

Our school commence one week earlier than normal school calender, so as to get started with our Annual Teaching Plans in their respective subjects.

Academic Progress Chart:
We use Grade 11 report as the base for statement of results, where at the top we put learner's name and stream. Then we have table where we put learners subjects and Grade11 results, and then set targets for first term. This is done in the presence of the parent so as to make sure that parents commit to the performance.

At the beginning of the second term, we (Principal-Parent and Learner) embark on checking if the set targets were met or not, then comment on performance per learner. After that, we set new targets for the 2nd term.

What differentiates our school from the rest, is that the tone is set right at the beginning of the year for our matriculants. We involve parents in our first consultative meeting, where we outline our colour coding method as the reminder since it is something that they have been familiarised with since Grade10 (FET Phase).

To keep up with high quality results, we set our targets to 50 percent,

where every learner strives for 50 and above. Colour coding simple means each term, learners will be grouped based on their performance and that performance will exclude task forming part of SBA, which means we analyse their performance based on raw marks.

In terms of colours, RED means danger. If a learner falls under that category, we then explain to both the learner and the parent the threats of the category and how the school will assist the learner with improving the areas of difficulties.

Papers concentration on different cognitive levels is then assigned to those learners.

The school always make sure that the are parents are involved, for close monitoring of progress.

As a norm, we teach, test, and give immediate feedback.
